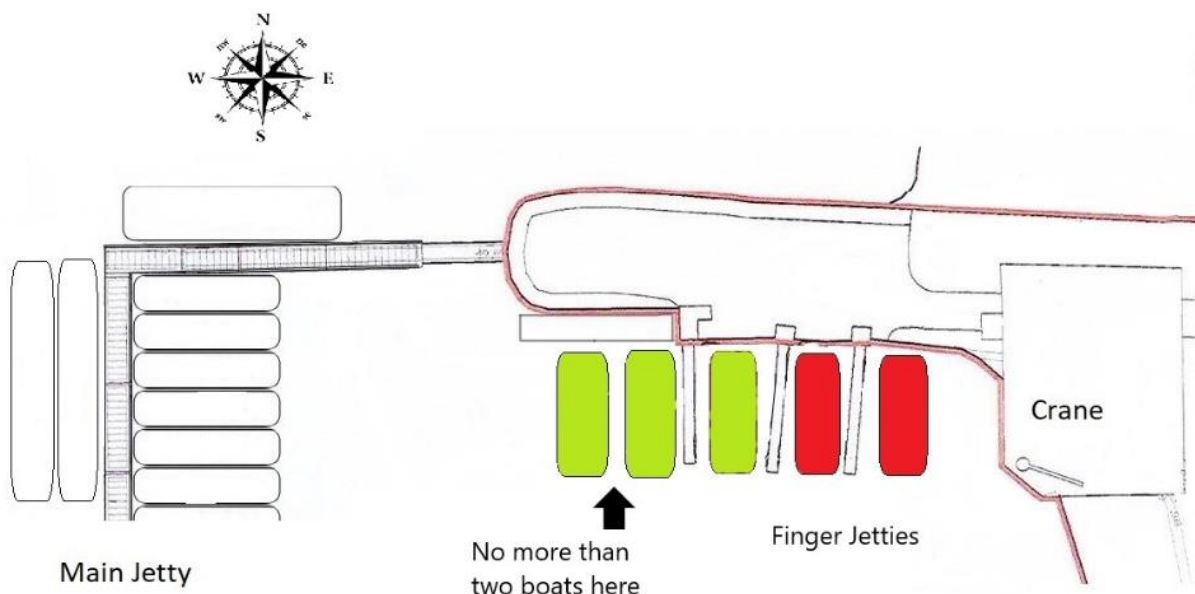
Berthing Policy

Due to the increase in boat numbers we have had to make some changes in our berthing policy in order to accommodate all of our members as well as we can.

From the 5th of June (after the Whit Weekend regatta) the following will apply:

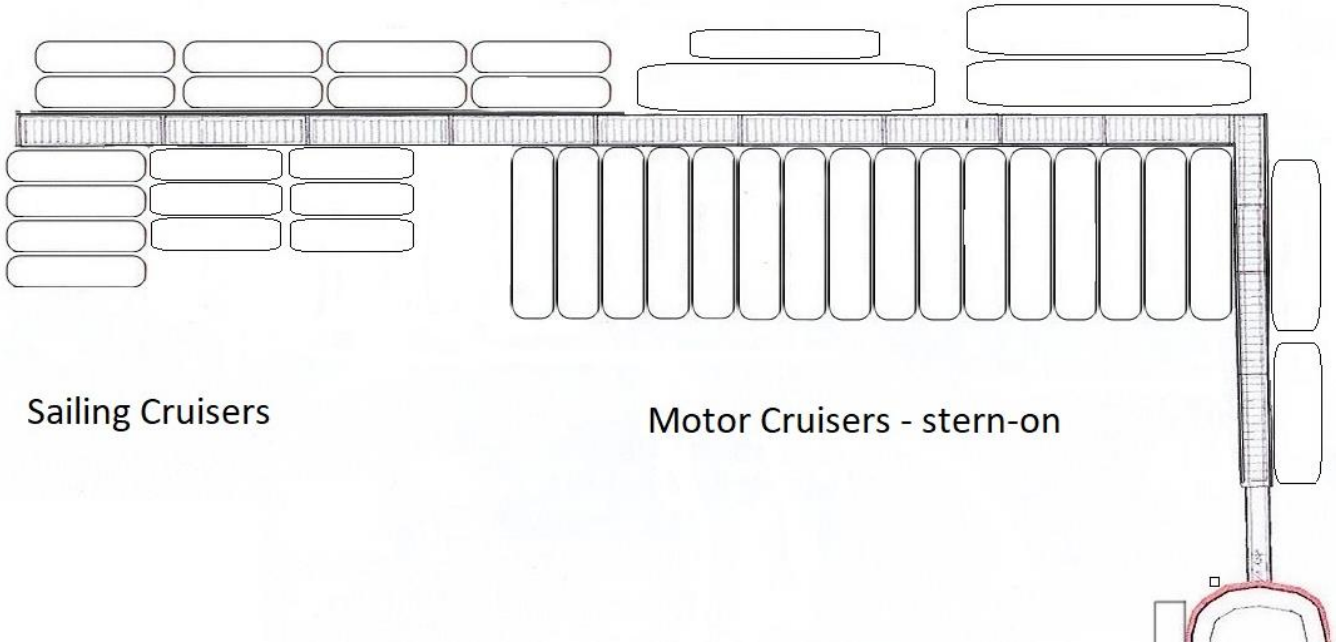
- The finger jetties, between the crane and main jetty, indicated with **red painted cleats**, **must be kept clear** as Visitor Member Berths (in **RED** below).
- These berths must be kept clear to be used exclusively as Temporary Berths for the use of members visiting the club at weekends and living aboard. Where a member leaves after the weekend, the boat **must be moved** to the main jetty or on to a swing mooring.
- The club reserves the right to move boats that do not adhere to this policy.
- If we find that we frequently have to move the same boats, we will automatically move them on to swing moorings.
- There is room for 2 boats (**only 2 boats!**) on the outside of the finger jetties (in **GREEN**). These are not reserved for visitors and are available for normal use.
- Please note: berths may not be reserved. Berths are available on first come first served basis.

We trust the members will understand that the above conditions are intended for the smooth running of the club for everyone.

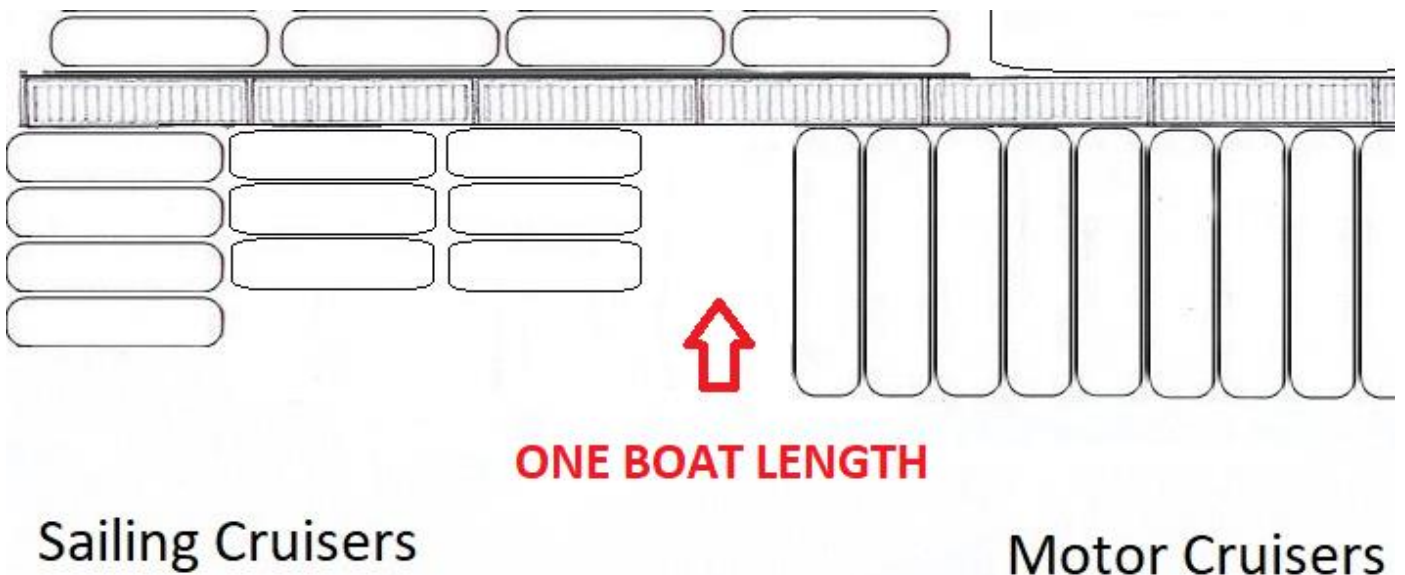


On the Main Jetty

- Motor cruisers must moor stern-on on the inside of the Main Jetty. This will help to accommodate a greater number of boats

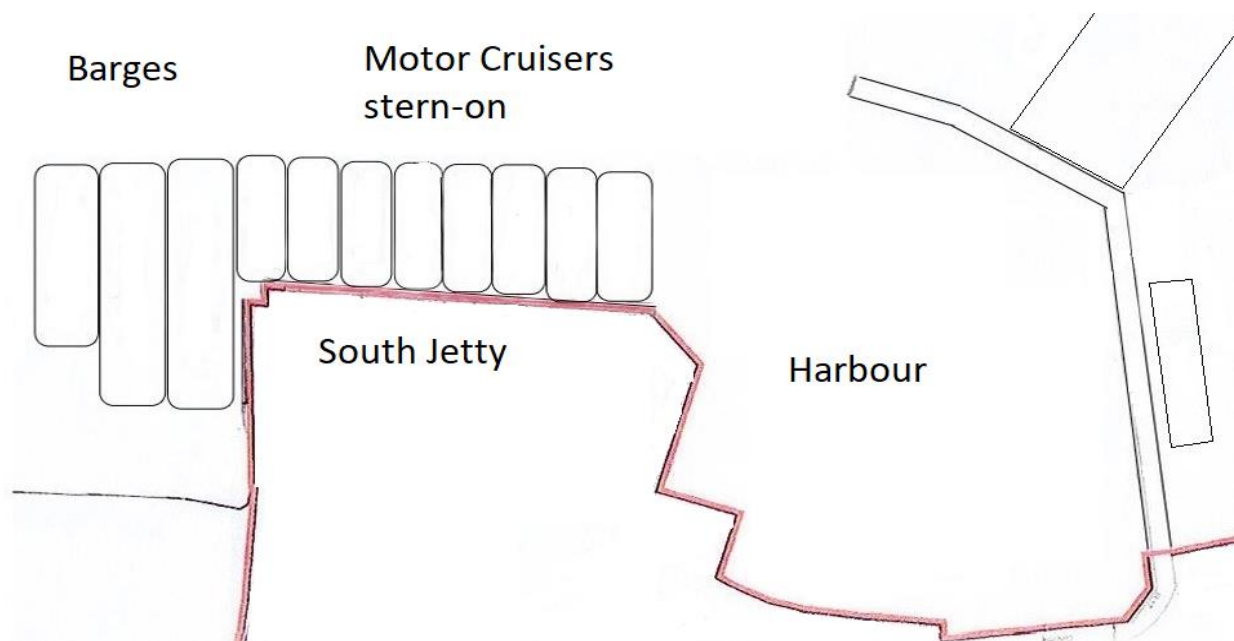


Please leave a gap of one boat length to allow for additional boats to moor stern-on.



South Jetty

- Motor cruisers must moor stern-on on the inside of the South Jetty. This will help to accommodate a greater number of boats.
- The south of the South Jetty is reserved for barges.



- For reasons of safety, please keep all jetties clear of all unnecessary equipment. Any equipment considered unsafe will be removed.
- The committee may ask a member to move their boat to accommodate access to someone with impaired mobility.
- Boats on the South Jetty staying a week or longer must put an anchor out to steady the bow. **Failure to do this could result in damage to neighbouring boats.**
