

Berthing Standard Operating Procedure in respect to Covid 19

PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

This document should be read in conjunction with the normal berthing policy.

Every user of the club facilities has a responsibility to act in a safe and respectful manner.

In addition to the directions below we would urge people to use common sense in order to keep you and your fellow members safe during these challenging times.

Thank you for your cooperation.

- All boats must have paid for berthing with the Treasurer and have checked with the Bosun before berthing at the club.
- Boats must be insured
- All visitors whether arriving by boat or otherwise must check in on our Covid 19 Tracing form: Contact Tracing Click Here
- Hand soap is provided at all out-door taps. We urge people to use them as directed by Covid 19 guidelines
- Once you have moored, it is recommended to use sanitiser i.e bleach spray on the jetty cleats as they may be used by other members.
- We strongly encourage that Members use a swing mooring or anchor when visiting the Club. If shore mooring is necessary, please abide by the conditions below.
- LRYC reserve the right to review this policy as they see fit to protect health & safety, in the event that our moorings are oversubscribed, the Club are operating on a first come first served basis.
- People must NOT CONGRETATE on the jetties.
- When arriving at LRYC and preparing to moor stern-on, please prepare your tender/dinghy to allow stern-on mooring. For example, if you have a rib on davits, please lower the rib into the water and move the rib to the side/bow of your boat prior to mooring.
- Please keep hand sanitiser/wipes close to the access point of your boat.
- Regularly sanitise the handrails and door handles at the access point to your boat.

- No parties or large groups are permitted to congregate on boats in the harbour. The ISA Community Pod system is in place for sailing so a similar approach will be used on cruisers.
- Please do not invite friends or relatives to visit you during regatta.
- Holding tanks must be used on cruisers as onshore facilities are limited.
- Onboard showers should be used as onshore shower facilities are not available.
- When filling water tanks, please use your own hose pipe and do not share hoses.
- To avoid airborne transmission, only open windows on the starboard side of your vessel.
- Please moor tenders/ribs at the bow of your vessel and only access from your own vessel.

Main Jetty

- Motor boats must moor stern-on on the inside of the jetty
- Please ensure that neighbouring boats do not have adjacent side doors open at the same time.
- For stern-to moorings, please use aft access to boats where available in order to avoid the use of side decks.
- Avoid opening windows opposite your neighbours open window.
- Please ensure that a free space of one boat length is maintained at the end of the stern-on moorings to facilitate new arrivals. It is not reasonable for an arriving boat to have to first create a space in order to moor.
- Sailing keel boats may moor in parallel in the area indicated on the plan.
- When crossing parallel moored boats, please only cross over the bow of the boat and avoid as much contact as possible.
- A drop-down space of one boat length will be marked out on the inside of the main jetty. This is to facilitate boats that are kept on moorings. It is for short stay only while loading or unloading boats. Please keep free otherwise.
- Only single boat parallel mooring is permitted on the outside of the main jetty.

South Jetty

- Motor boats must moor stern-on on the inside of the jetty
- Please ensure that any boat side accesses are not opposite your neighbours' to insure that social distancing is maintained.
- Barges will moor on the south end of the jetty.
- When crossing parallel moored barges, please only cross over the bow of the boat and avoid as much contact as possible.
