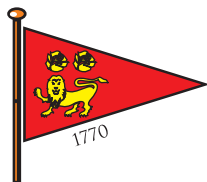

NOTICE OF RACE (NoR) **LRYC ANNUAL REGATTA**

1st - 7th August, 2026

The Organising Authority (OA) for this event is LRYC.

The notation '[NP]' in a rule means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes *RRS* 60.1.

The notation '[DP]' in a rule means that the penalty for a breach of the rule, may, at the discretion of the protest committee, be less than disqualification.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the *rules* as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.
- 1.2 [NP] The sub-headings of SB20 Class Rule C5.1 (Mandatory Equipment which shall be carried at all times) is deleted entirely and replaced with:
- (a) One tow line, not less than 10m long and 6mm diameter,
 - (b) Two paddles of combined minimum weight not less than 1kg,
 - (c) A functioning VHF radio,
 - (d) First aid kit in waterproof container,
 - (e) A knife or a multi-tool containing a knife,
- This Changes SB20 Class Rule C5.1.

2 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS (SIs)

- 2.1 The SIs will be notified by Friday 31st July and also available at Registration (times listed below at 9.1).

3 COMMUNICATION

- 3.1 Notices will be posted on the Notice Window situated at the front of the clubhouse and may also be copied on the event WhatsApp Group which can be joined [HERE](#) or by scanning the QR code.
- 3.2 [NP] While racing, except in an emergency, a boat shall not make voice or data transmissions and shall not receive voice or data communications which are not available to all boats. This applies also to mobile 'phones.



4 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 4.1 The regatta is open to all boats of the following classes: Keelboat, SB20, Shannon-One-Design, ILCA (Laser), Optimist & Youth (PY). (Other classes may be added at the absolute discretion of the OA).
- 4.2 Depending on the number of entries, the OA reserves the right to merge, subdivide or allocate to any class, combine the starts of classes, or cancel racing for any class. A minimum entry of three boats per class will be required for a start.
- 4.3 Entries shall be completed online [HERE](#) or by using this link <https://www.lryc.ie/event/annual-regatta/> and will be accepted up to and including Friday 31st July at 18:00. Later manual entries may be accepted.

5 FEES

- 5.1 All relevant Association, Club and Entry fees must be paid, and Declaration and Registration forms duly completed in advance of a boat competing in the regatta.

5.2 Required fees are as follows:

5.3 Where entries and relevant fees are received on or before Friday 24th July, 2026, a reduction of €30 will apply to each Family Race Entry subject to a maximum race entry fee per family of €260 (after discount).

6 CREW LIMITATIONS

6.1 Class Rules relating to numbers of crew shall apply, except, if otherwise notified. This changes *RRS 87*.

7 ADVERTISING

7.1 [NP] [DP]

(a) Boats may be required to display advertising chosen and supplied by the OA.

(b) Other such advertisements relating to boats will only be allowed if prior permission is sought and obtained in writing from the OA.

8 QUALIFYING AND FINAL SERIES - Not Used

9 SCHEDULE

9.1 Registration and Ticket Collection

Registration will take place in the Clubhouse on Friday 31st July between 19:00-20:00 and Saturday 1st August between 09:00-11:00.

9.2 Briefings

There will be a Competitors' Briefing at the Clubhouse on Saturday 1st August at 09:30 immediately followed by a Juniors' Briefing which will take place at the steps on the lawn in front of the clubhouse.

9.3 Schedule of Racing

Racing is scheduled as set out in the Racing Schedule (pages 5-8 of this document).

9.4 The schedule may, at the discretion of the RC, be amended except that there will be no race started before the scheduled time of the first race for any specific class.

9.5 No warning signal will be made for any race after 14:00 on Friday 7th August.

10 EQUIPMENT INSPECTION

10.1 [DP] All Boats and Equipment may be inspected at any time during the Regatta for compliance with Class and Event rules. Class inspections by Class designated measurers may be undertaken during the week as announced by the OA.

11 CLOTHING AND EQUIPMENT

11.1 All competitors shall wear adequate personal flotation devices at all times when afloat, except briefly while changing or adjusting clothing or personal equipment. Dry suits and wet suits are not adequate personal flotation devices. This changes *RRS 40*.

12 VENUE

12.1 Racing areas will be based from LRYC and will be further described in the SIs.

13 COURSES

13.1 Courses will be described in the SIs. Courses for each race to be sailed will be indicated at least 30 minutes before the start, unless otherwise indicated.

14 PENALTY SYSTEM

- 14.1 The first two sentences of *RRS* 44.1 are changed to: "A boat may take a One-Turn Penalty when she may have broken one or more *rules* of *RRS* Part 2 or *RRS* 31 in an incident while racing. **However in the SOD class only**, when she may have broken one or more *rules* of Part 2 while in the zone around a mark other than a starting mark, her penalty shall be a Two-Turns Penalty."
- 14.2 Except if the course is shortened to finish at the windward mark, penalties, while in the zone of the windward mark or on an offset/wing mark leg, may be delayed and taken as soon as possible on the downwind leg. This changes *RRS* 44.2.

15 SCORING

- 15.1 One (1) race is required to constitute a series.
- 15.2 Except, in The Delany Memorial Salver & The Starter's Gun, as described on page 9,
- (a) When fewer than four (4) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.
 - (b) When from four (4) to seven (7) races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.
 - (c) When eight (8) or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.
- 15.3 Handicaps, where relevant, will be further described in the SIs.
- 15.4 Keelboats results will be calculated using LRYC Handicaps set before the start of the event and will be reviewed before Tuesday 4th August.

16 SUPPORT PERSON VESSELS - See also SI23 (Insurance)

- 16.1 **SPV's shall not create a wake** that interferes with a boat which is *racing*.

17 CHARTERED OR LOANED BOATS - Not Used

18 BERTHING

- 18.1 [DP] [NP] Berthing spaces afloat and ashore, where available, will be allocated ON THE BASIS OF ENTRIES RECEIVED BY Wednesday 22nd July and will be displayed online by Friday 24th July. (This includes accommodation vessels) Boats shall be berthed in their allocated spaces. Please obey instructions from the berthing master. Berthing must be booked and paid for online.

19 HAUL OUT RESTRICTIONS

- 19.1 [DP] Keelboats shall not be hauled out during the event except with and according to the terms of prior written permission of the RC.

20 DIVING EQUIPMENT AND PLASTIC POOLS - Not Used

21 DATA PROTECTION

- 21.1 By entering you provide data to the OA.
LRYC Data Protection Policy is available on <https://www.lryc.ie/policy/>.
- 21.2 MEDIA WAIVER: Competitors give their consent to the OA to use or to license the use of their name, comments, photographs and likenesses as it sees fit for the promotion of the Club & Regatta. The OA reserves the right to use or to license the use of any images and sound recordings during the event free of charge. The OA will use personal data for the purpose of administering the event.

22 RISK STATEMENT AND DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

- 22.1 *RRS* 3 states: 'The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue to race is hers alone.' By participating in this event each competitor

agrees and acknowledges that sailing is a potentially dangerous activity with inherent risks. These risks include strong winds and rough seas, sudden changes in weather, failure of equipment, boat handling errors, poor seamanship by other boats, loss of balance on an unstable platform and fatigue resulting in increased risk of injury.

Inherent in the sport of sailing is the risk of permanent, catastrophic injury or death by drowning, trauma, hypothermia or other causes.

23 INSURANCE

- 23.1 Each participating boat and SPV shall be insured with valid and adequate third-party liability insurance for the duration of the regatta.

24 PRIZES

- 24.1 Prizes will be given as described in pages 5-10 of this document.
24.2 Trophies are to be returned by arrangement to Rachel Algeo at the start of next season. Phone: 086 1014140. Engraving of trophies is the responsibility of competitors.

25 FURTHER INFORMATION

- 25.1 Competitors are granted temporary membership of LRYC for the duration of the regatta, subject only to the provisions of the Club rules for withdrawing or withholding such membership.
